

CATSHILL MIDDLE SCHOOL SPORTS PREMIUM SPEND 2016/2017

Amount of sports premium funding received in 2016/17: £8650

The government is providing funding of £150 million per annum to provide new and substantial primary school sport funding. The funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school Head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. Each school will receive £8,000 plus an extra £5 per pupil each year until 2020. The money can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools. The money will be used so that all children benefit regardless of their sporting ability.



For the financial year 2017/18 the school should receive £1600.
