Year 7 Catch-up Funding

At Catshill Middle School we receive additional funding from the Department for Education to provide literacy and numeracy catch-up support for those pupils who did not achieve the national average in reading, writing and/or mathematics in Year 6.

We use the money we receive in the following ways to ensure these pupils are given the opportunity to make accelerated progress and catch-up their peers as quickly as possible:

Year 7 Catch-up Funding 2016-17

The allocation to the school is £8,232

Additional specialist support has been introduced in both maths and English in Year 7.

- Booster sessions, including 1 to 1, have been introduced to narrow gaps and enable pupils to make accelerated progress.
- Additional resources have been purchased in maths and English to support the achievement of these pupils.
- Additional staff training for teaching of these intervention programmes.

- **Impact**

Year 7 Catch-up funding is enabling the school to ensure pupils who did not achieve expected standard in their KS2 tests make accelerated progress in Year 7, catching up their peers rapidly. As a result, these pupils leave Catshill Middle School with results in line with their peers in Year 8.

The Governing Body monitors the impact of Year 7 Catch-up funding and outcomes for pupils very closely. Mr J Thompson, Head of School can provide additional data information for this cohort.
